Now's the perfect time to start so many veggies from seed:

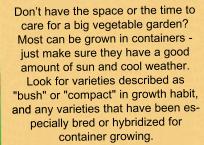
-Beet -Collards -Mustard -Radish -Carrot -Garlic -Onion -Swiss chard
